



3.3. The questions below refer to the current Scope of Practice of a Dental Assistant. Indicate whether the statement is <b>True</b> or <b>False</b> . (5)
5.3.1 Dental Assistants are allowed to place radiographic films in the patients mouth and then "take" the radiograph by pressing the activating button/switch.
Dental Assistants are not allowed to write the charting and patient treatment notes in the file, even if the oral health professional signs off the entry at the end of the entry.
5.3.3 Dental assistants have to register with the Health Professions Counci of South Africa, and once registered the HPCSA allows them to work without supervision.
6.3.4 A dental assistant may, if instructed by the oral health professional, undertake non-invasive procedures such as the scaling and polishing of a patients teeth.
